



(NUCUAA), a lay organization, is to promote Church Ushering throughout the member States without regard to race, creed, or denomination. The Organization is committed to the perpetuation of a silent uniform method of Church Ushering, which strives to stimulate an interest in church ushering; to promote growth through the development and implementation of innovative programs; and to raise the spiritual, moral, and social awareness of its membership. ARTICLE II. Section 1. Object	Section 1. Object. The purposes of the National United Church Ushers Association of America, Inc. hereinafter called the Association, shall be to create an association of church members devoted to the lay ministry of church ushering; to supply and furnish ushers for worship services, entertainments, weddings, and any other purposes whenever and wherever ushers are necessary; to stimulate interest in this aspect of church work without regard to race, creed, or denomination; to develop a uniform technique of church ushering; to conduct literary societies, workshop training sessions, and entertainment; to	Section 1. Object. The purposes of the National United Church Ushers Association of America, Inc. hereinafter called the Association, shall be to create an association of church members devoted to the lay ministry of church ushering; to supply and furnish ushers for church services and entertainments; to stimulate interest in this aspect of church work without regard to race, creed, or denomination; to develop a silent uniform technique of church ushering; to conduct workshop and training sessions; to promote service to humanity; and to advance the spiritual and moral development of the members to work harmoniously. inculcate the principles of good citizenship in its members; to promote service to humanity; to develop friendship, peace and good will among men; and to advance the spiritual and moral development of the members through the precept of the Fatherhood of God and the Eternal Brotherhood of Man.

The objective is to create a national organization of church ushers for the effectuation of the foregoing purposes by the establishment of affiliated state organizations of church ushers in the manner prescribed in this instrument and the bylaws promulgated under its authority.

### ARTICLE II. Section 3. Purpose

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the Bylaws is to perfect the organization of the Association; to provide for the government, management and control of the affairs of the Association; to regulate the conduct of the members of the Association and define their obligations; to provide penalties including, but not limited to removal from office and censure as a delegate for breach of the Association's rules and regulations; and to change, alter, or amend such provisions of the Charter as are purely administrative in their nature pursuant to the authority of the Pennsylvania Nonprofit Corporation

maintain a cooperative relationship with state affiliations as prescribed by the bylaws. July 2021

Section 3. The Association shall have the authority to bring charges against any accused Officer, Member, Delegate, Agent, Director, or Board of Directors of the Association and after review of such charges as provided for in Article IV - Section 27 of these Bylaws. After a finding that the charges are valid, the penalty for such action shall be any one of the following: fines (not less than \$5,000.00 and not to exceed \$10,000); suspension of rights and privileges of delegate status; prohibition to hold any office; or expulsion from the Association. July 2021

The amount was changed to apply to current penalties.

The Bylaw Committee recommends approval of this change.

	The Association shall have the authority to bring charges against any accused Officer, Member, Delegate, Agent, Director, or Board of Directors of the Association and after review of such charges as provided for in Article IV - Section 27 of these Bylaws. After a finding that the charges are valid, the penalty for such action shall be any one of the following: fines (not to exceed \$2,000.00); suspension of rights and privileges of delegate status; prohibition to hold any office for up to five years; or expulsion from the Association.
