Jesus is the Reason for the Season! Rejoice!





Christmas is a special opportunity to put aside the material world and focus on the spiritual aspirations of peace and joy. Christmas can be a time of healing and renewed strength.



Biography

Rev. Dr. Jewel Anthony Simmons

Rev. Dr. Jewel A. Simmons was raised in Hammond Louisiana, one of five children to the late Ruth and John Simmons. As a child, he attended Greenfield Missionary Baptist Church before joining the United States Air Force in 1974.

As a youth, Pastor Simmons had an unusual curiosity to study and understand the gospel, and love for Christ. In 1978, at the age of 21, he was called by God to ministry, in Charleston, South Carolina while on active duty. During his time on active duty, Pastor Simmons volunteered to serve as an auxiliary Air Force Chaplain in Overseas areas such as; Germany, Portugal, and the United Kingdom to ensure the cultural experiences of the local community church were available to minority Soldiers, Sailors, and Airmen stationed in these Overseas areas.

Dr. Simmons' love for community and the Lord kept him actively involved in the Northern Virginia Community. He served as Chaplain with the American Legion, Post 114 of Manassas, one of the oldest African American Post in the State of Virginia. He served as a counselor with Fairfax County Offenders Aid and Restoration Program, assisting offenders in finding and establishing new directions for themselves and their families. Dr. Simmons served as a volunteer with Virginia's "Meals on Wheels" Program and the Fairfax Adult Education Program, providing tutoring to adults seeking to complete their high school education.

While living in Prince William County, Dr. Simmons was appointed to serve as a Human Rights Commissioner. In this position, he worked with other commissioners on housing and job discrimination issues affecting citizens in Prince William, Fairfax, Arlington, and Alexandria, as well as coordinating with commissioners across the state of Virginia. He and his wife were the founders of the Pastoral Care and Counseling Ministry at First Baptist Church of Manassas, providing training and Christian Counseling for families and couples in resolving present-day interpersonal relationship issues. After completing seminary and serving as an associate minister at First Baptist Manassas, Dr. Jewel Simmons was called to service as Pastor of Providence Baptist Church on May 2, 2009. In 2018, he was also selected to serve as President of the Six District of the Northern

Virginian Baptist Association and member of the Commission on Education with the NVBA.

Dr. Simmons' educational journey includes attending Eastern Illinois University, where he completed his undergraduate degrees in civil engineering and industrial technology. Attended Troy State University, completing his Master's in Public Administration, and Freedom Seminary where he completed graduate degrees in Theology and Clinical Pastoral Counseling, and his Doctorate in Counseling at Freedom in partnership with Jacksonville Seminary.


He is a certified Theophostic and Temperament Counselor, and a Licensed Clinical Pastoral Counselor, and served as a member of the National Association of Christian Counselors (NACC), and, the American Association of Christian Counselors (AACC).

As part of the federal workforce, Dr. Simmons served at the highest levels in the Department of Defense (working in the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller)/CFO) and with the Director of National Intelligence (DNI)) before retirement. He is the recipient of numerous defense and intelligence awards, among these, are; the Secretary of Defense, Award for Excellence, and the Director of National Intelligence Award for Collaboration Leadership. Pastor Simmons' work with the United States Military and the United States National Intelligence Community included working as a manager in areas such as environmental science, civil engineering, and program and financial management.

He is married to Mrs. Andrea Mangram-Simmons of Burke, Virginia, and they currently live in Chantilly Virginia, with his wife's beloved little dog, Sunny. Their daughter Peitra, lives in Emporia Va., and they have two grandsons.

INTRODUCTION

The Master's Degree Program serves as an incentive for the Delegates attending the National Convention to strive beyond the achievement of obtaining a Bachelor Degree. The Bachelor Degree requires the Delegates to attend the National Convention for three (3) consecutive years and attend the School of Ushering Sessions each year. The Master's Degree Program is designed to give the Delegates an in depth knowledge of the history of the National Organization, the George T. Grier School of Ushering Department, along with perfecting the techniques of various signs and signals used in Church Ushering. The duration of the course is three (3) consecutive years.

Master's Degree Program Criteria:

Delegate is required to have a George T. Grier School of Ushering Department National Diploma.

- Delegate is required to have a George T. Grier School of Ushering Department Bachelor Degree.
- 3. Instructor's Certificate is not required.
- Delegate must enroll in the Master's Degree Program by the designated registration deadline.
- Delegate must be enrolled in the Master Degree Program for three (3) consecutive years. A break within the three (3) years will require the Delegate to start over by enrolling in the next upcoming Master's Degree Program.
- During the third year, the Delegate will write a Thesis on an assigned topic. (Thesis topic to be determined.)
 The Thesis shall be a minimum of five (5) typewritten pages, double space, Time New Roman, Font size 12.
 The beginning of each paragraph shall be indented.
- The Thesis maximum score is 100%. The passing score is 80%.
- Also, during the third year, the Delegate will take a Written Test, consisting of ten (10) questions. The maximum score is 100%. The passing score is 90%.
- Delegate must attend all Master's Degree Program classes offered at the National Convention during the three year period.

The 3rd Master's Degree Program Start Date:

The Master's Degree Program will start July, 2022, at the seat of the National Convention. The 3rd Graduation will be held in July, 2025 at the seat of the National Convention. Graduation Day will occur on Friday during the School of Ushering Session.

Application for the Master's Degree Program:

The Delegate shall submit the required Application for the Master's Degree Program to the National Chairman, George T. Grier School of Ushering Department, and MUST BE POST MARKED BY December 30, 2021. Send application and required documents to the following: NOTE: Emails will not be accepted.

Only fifty (50) Delegates will be accepted in to the 2021 Master's Degree Program. The first (50) acceptable applications received and post marked by December 30, 2021 with the required certifications will be accepted in to the program.




